Here are some fun and meaningful ideas to wrap up for your family:

## **Custom T-Shirts or Work Shirts**

Gift Idea: Design custom t-shirts or work shirts with a fun slogan or logo related to the build day, like "Team [Family Name] Builds" or "Hammering Homes Together." **Gift Idea:** Customized water bottles or thermoses with their names and the phrase "Built to Help."

**Why It Works:** Staying hydrated on the build day is important, and a reusable water bottle is both practical and sustainable. Plus, it adds a personal touch.
